

## REFURBISHMENT WORKS AT THE INTERNATIONAL PASSENGER CONCOURSE

### PROJECT NOTICE UPDATE (No.: 2)

Subject : Replacement of International Terminal Concourse ceiling and New Flooring

#### Update No. 2

Installation of the new ceiling and floor tiles within the hoarded off area nearer the end of the ex-Skychef restaurant area and towards the main entrance of the International Departure Lounge has been completed.

The next phase of works is scheduled as follows;

- Contractor will commence works to shift hoarding to the opposite side, which is at the back of Turkish Airline Office and over the banking complex, including the Turkish Airline Office after the departure of Emirates Airline 708 to Dubai as of Monday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2021.
- The hoarding may take several days to be completed and is expected to be in place for two months. This particular work will be done every night of the week until completed.
- Upon completion of the new hoarding, a passageway will be maintained in front of the international departure lounge for passengers and other airport users to move between the international and domestic terminals.
- Once all the hoardings are erected, works will then commence to install a new ceiling and then a new tiled flooring.
- See below pictures of the intended hoarding plan at the banking complex and Turkish Airline office.



The hoarding plan makes provision for:

- a passageway from the corner edge of SCAA's Airport Permit Office, to the entrance of the Turkish Airline office and;
  - a tunnel (raised platform above) over the banking complex (ATMs and Money Changers) and Turkish Airline office to ensure access to services in this area whilst the contractor is able to work above in the ceiling area.
- Note that the tunnel access created will be one-way only (direction: from the International Terminal towards the Domestic Terminal) due to space limitations. Both these changes will be guided by the appropriate informational / directional signages and through directives given on site by SCAA officers. Airport users are advised to use other routes when moving from the Domestic Terminal to the International Passenger Concourse.

In addition to the above provisions, the "Sey Wrap" baggage wrapping business will be relocated to the corner of the Ex-Skychef restaurant, inside the sitting area adjoining the International Departure Lounge. The Cable & Wireless digital kiosk currently located near "Sey Wrap" will be also be relocated and will be set up near the "Aqua Studio" shop.

Additional informational and directional signages will be installed around the hoarded area to guide and advise passengers and airport users.

Noisy works and some dust may be generated throughout this project and all measures are being undertaken to reduce the inconveniences to all airport users.

All airport users are to continue with following any instructions as issued from SCAA officers at the terminal.

With this new phase of hoarded area, SCAA would like to specifically highlight that the traditional means of queuing **in front** of the ATMs and Money Changer businesses will not be possible once the new hoarding is erected in full. Accordingly, a new queuing arrangement will be made on the side of the ATMs and Money Changers, which will be controlled with barrier stands, signages and guidance from SCAA officers. Adaptation and adherence to the new queuing arrangements will be for the benefit of all airport users and it will be an appreciated contribution in maintaining an acceptable level of service at our airport during this construction phase.
